

Synopsis

I should just say in defence of this book by the above reviewer that the error of Vivaldi's date of birth

(quoted as 1762) is likely to be a simple typo, as the date (which should read 1962!) refers to when Vivaldi's true date of birth was REDISCOVERED in the 20th Century, as stated earlier in the book.
